Families stay in their own villa – complete with two bedrooms and two bathrooms – and so much more. Mayor Clayton, GKTW's six-foot tall bunny mascot, tucks children into bed each night, pizza is delivered right to the doorstep, and each villa is stocked with favorite snacks and all of the comforts of home. During their stay, the "Gift-giving Fairy" visits the family villas, leaving behind a special gift for each child. This experience quickly becomes a treasured tradition as each day the children race into their villa to see what special surprise awaits them. GKTW gives away 18,000 gifts annually to support this small part of the magical Village experience.

A GKTW Wish vacation includes a week of non-stop fun and laughter. Families receive donated tickets to the world-famous attractions Walt Disney World, SeaWorld Orlando and Universal Orlando. In addition, each park's most popular characters visit the Village for personal photo opportunities, autographs and lots of hugs.

The Village itself is a child's dream come to life. Families dine in the Gingerbread House Restaurant, explore the interactive Marc's Dino Putt miniature golf course, and explore the magical Castle of Miracles. The stunning building features a forest to explore, a game room, a talking Wishing Well and the beautiful, one-of-a-kind, fully wheelchair accessible carousel, which has no limits to the number of times young guests may take a magical ride.

To date, more than 90,000 children from all 50 states and

more than 65 countries have seen their dreams come true at GKTW. Since the very beginning, GKTW has pledged to never turn away a child in need – and it never has. A GKTW Wish can be organized in as little as 24 hours. Currently, the Village can provide accommodations for 100 families each night – but 70 percent of the year, the need exceeds that number, and families booked for a GKTW Wish must stay off-site at a nearby hotel.

To ensure that all families are given the opportunity to experience the full Village vacation, GKTW began an amazing expansion project three years ago.

The Fairy Tale Forest is the newest part of GKTW. Once completed, 42 new villas will provide accommodations for GKTW guests. Earlier this

summer, GKTW celebrated the grand opening of the first two new villas – a brightly colored purple castle and a charming cottage. Both look like they came straight out of a fairy tale.

The centerpiece of the expansion is Matthew's Boundless Playground, the world's only life-sized Candy Land game. Complete with a colorful trail that leads through Gumdrop Pass and the Lollipop Forest to the Candy Castle, Matthew's Boundless Playground also includes models of classic Candy Land characters King Kandy, Princess Frostine and Gloppy, as well as playground equipment designed for children with disabilities. Donated by Hasbro, Inc., Matthew's Boundless Playground welcomes GKTW guests to enjoy the colorful and "sweet" play-

land, created just for them.

Of course, it is all about the children of GKTW, and every day, the Village receives letters from Wish families, describing their wonderful week and how it inspired them to face their brave battles once they returned home.

One of the most treasured letters to the Village came from Alyssa Petruska, who visited the Village when she was three. She wrote:

"Dear GKTW: I am a cancer survivor and a former Give Kids The World Wish child. I had kidney cancer and I got so sick mommy and the doctors got very scared. Then I went to GKTW where I could be happy again. I believe that being at GKTW made me better. I told all my doctors and nurses to send all the sick kids there.

Mommy says that GKTW

made me strong and happy again. When you are little, sick, tired, and scared being lucky enough to go somewhere where no one hurts you and mommies don't cry is the most special gift in the world!"

Today, Alyssa is a happy, healthy 10 year old, who still visits the Village and tells everyone about the magical place that helped her feel better.

GKTW could not do all that it does without the support, love and dedication of thousands of generous individuals and corporations worldwide. 2008 park winners showcase the Best of the Best

Schlitterbahn Galveston Island makes a major splash as Best Indoor Waterpark

Like an unstoppable freight train, Cedar Point and Schlitterbahn continue to run with Best Park and Best Waterpark categories. For 11 straight years these two parks have enthralled guests and our voters.

John Hildebrandt, general manager of Cedar Point, says the park’s numerous awards have been scattered around the park, from the Town Hall Museum to the various offices. “We will rotate the 2008 Best Park Award, passing it from office to office - a little like the Stanley Cup in Hockey.” When asked how he feels once the season winds down, Hildebrandt responds, “It’s bittersweet. It’s a long season, and you look forward to more time with your family. At the same time you know you will miss the excitement of the park, all the people, the sights and sounds. November and December we rest. Bust shortly after the first of the year I am thinking about summer.”

The Best Park category sees Busch Gardens Europe rising to place second this year, followed by



Knoebels in third and Disneyland in fourth. Tying for fifth is Islands of Adventure and Pleasure Beach Blackpool. Each of these parks is known for a critical component and a right mix of ingredients that isolates them above the rest. Along with the remainder of the top 10, each visiting patron is bound to have an outstanding day at these parks.

For waterparks, it is hard to follow Schlitterbahn’s 53 percent take of the vote. Placing second is Splashin’ Safari, Holiday World’s waterpark, which has grown from humble beginnings to a huge complex of heavy

capacity waterslides and attractions. Completing the top five are Blizzard Beach in Orlando, Noah’s Ark in Wisconsin Dells, and Typhoon Lagoon, also at the Walt Disney World resort in Orlando.

Amusement Today is making Best Indoor Waterpark an annual category. This year, top prize goes to Schlitterbahn Galveston Island. With its innovative quick-change roof, the original phase of the Galveston property can operate year round. Stocked with an indoor Torrent river, children’s area, neighboring speed slides, a surfing machine and exhilarating family slides with fun banking, the park offers a lot from mild to wild.

“Schlitterbahn Galveston Island has been a huge hit not only for the guests who are coming to us, but it has also been a tourism economic engine for the city as well,” says Jeffrey Siebert, director of communications for Schlitterbahn. “People are coming and staying overnight. It’s bringing people down and is really becoming Houston’s playground.”

Other finalists in this category are World

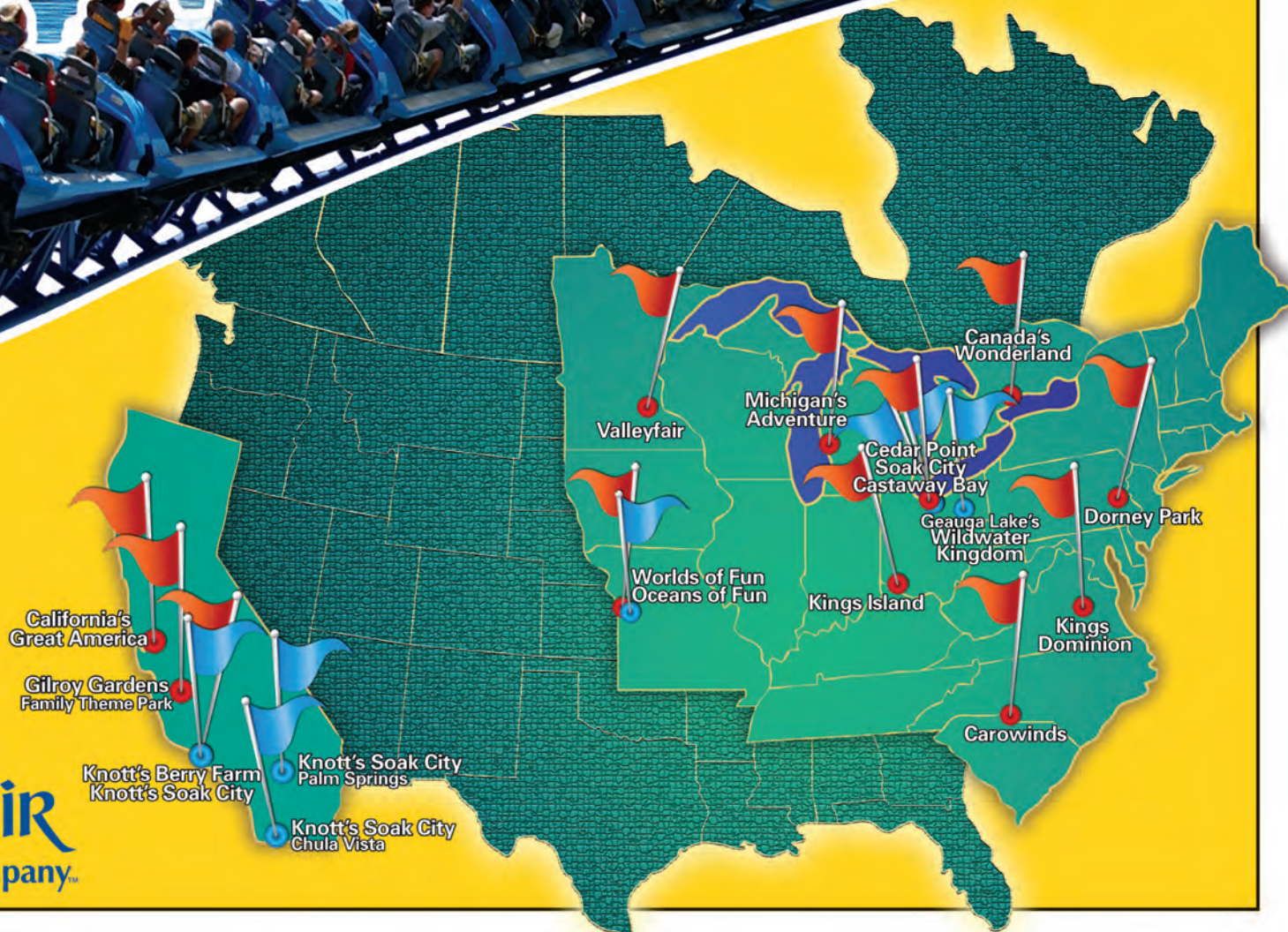

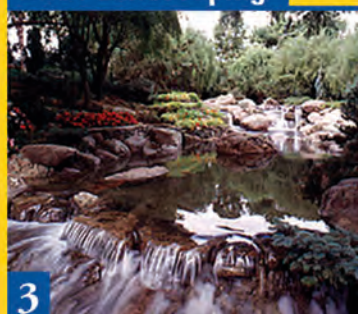

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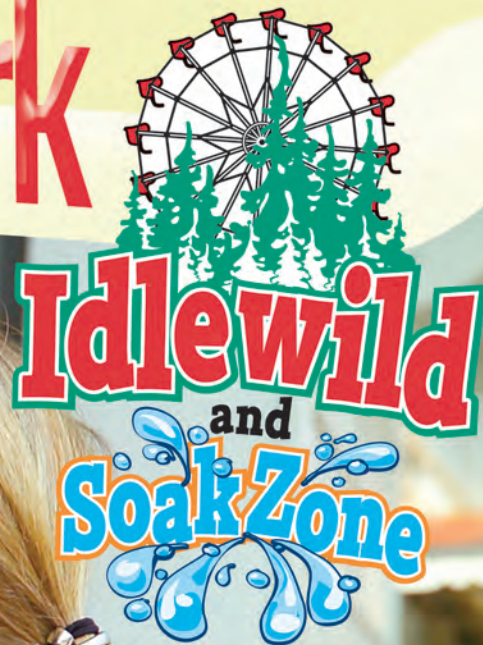

Waterpark inside the mammoth West Edmonton Mall in second, and the pair of **Kalahari Resorts** coming in third and fourth, Ohio and Wisconsin respectively. The two Kalahari properties are the two largest indoor waterparks in the United States. Sandusky's **Castaway Bay** rounds out the top five.

Santa Cruz Beach Boardwalk returns for a second year win with a solid 46 percent of the vote for Best Seaside Park. The west coast landmark has thrilled patrons for over 100 years.

Pleasure Beach Blackpool places second with 30 percent. **Morey's Piers** on the east coast comes in third, and **Kemah Boardwalk** represents the south with a fourth place nab.

Legoland California seems to maintain its hold on the Best Children's Park category with its mix of beautiful landscaping, fun rides meant for families to share together, and a vast array of ever-so-cool Lego sculptures.

Idlewild in Pennsylvania captures the imagination of younger guests with its rides, waterpark, and interactive

climbing structures. Idlewild ranks second on the chart once again. **Farup Sommerland** in far off Denmark has entertained numerous members of our panel. The park is loaded with family rides and coasters, and a seemingly endless string of activities to jump, climb and bounce, many of which American parks would shy away from. **Dutch Wonderland**, also in Pennsylvania, places fourth, and a tie for fifth is shared between **Memphis Kiddie Park** outside Cleveland, Ohio and **Sesame Place**, also once again, in Pennsylvania.

There's nothing fishy about the lock on Best Marine Life Park. Busch's family of SeaWorld parks control this category. **SeaWorld Orlando's** 56 percent of the vote make it the biggest pie piece on any of our charts. With the innovative new Manta coaster sailing in to the park in 2009, it wouldn't appear the Orlando property is about to lose grasp on the Golden Ticket any time soon.

Sister parks in **San Antonio** and **San Diego** come in at respective second and third place slots. Unlike the other two properties, **SeaWorld San Antonio** also offers an included waterpark for visitors, as well as an assortment of coasters and water rides for the whole family. A tie for fourth is shared between **Discovery Cove** in Orlando and **Six Flags Discovery Kingdom** in Vallejo, California.

Holiday World, Busch Gardens Europe and Knoebels all repeat winners

John Chidester, director of marketing for Holiday World and Splashin' Safari, knows the guest experience is something special. The park has built a legendary reputation for cleanliness and friendliness. Chidester credits the hospitality training that all the employees go through. "They also learn by example," he says. "They see Will and Mrs. Koch cleaning and talking to people. We like to engage our guests and be a part of the guest experience."

This winning philosophy sees **Holiday World** once again taking the Golden Ticket for two categories — Friendliest Employees and Cleanest Park.

In the Friendliest category, **Dollywood** boasts a strong second with 27 percent of the vote behind Holiday World's 32 percent. Other finalists are **Knoebels**, **Silver Dollar City**, and **Beech Bend Amusement Park**.

Earning their place in the top five for Cleanest Park are **Busch Gardens Europe** in second place, **Dollywood** and **Magic Kingdom** in a third place tie, and **Disneyland** finishing up the top five.

Eating at a park can elicit different responses from park

Six Flags Fiesta Texas takes Best Show category; Epcot's Illumination wins Best Outdoor Show Production; Universal Orlando takes back Halloween and Dollywood celebrates win for Best Christmas Event

A hot afternoon or a sudden rain shower are good reasons to duck into a show while at a park. But sometimes the shows alone are reason to go.

Six Flags Fiesta Texas makes it 10 straight years of Best Shows. New for 2008 was Blast Fever, a modified version of the touring band production, and a 70s version of Rockville. Director of Entertainment Ben McTyre says, "The Golden Tickets have a very positive impact on the performers, the

rest of the department, and the park as a whole." McTyre adds, "The performers love being in front of an audience. It's great to be recognized as being the best at what you do."

Fast on their heels is **Dollywood** with its top-notch show entertainment. Rounding out the five finalists are **Disney's Hollywood Studios**, **Silver Dollar City**, and **Busch Gardens Europe**.

Epcot, **Fiesta Texas**, and **Disneyland** hang on to their respective first, second, and third place wins in Best Outdoor (Night) Production they gar-



nered on the charts last year. A new player to this category is **Hard Rock Park** with their Bohemian Rhapsody inspired finale taking fourth. **Disney's Hollywood Studios'** Fantasmic comes in fifth.

The competition for first place can sometimes be scary. **Universal Orlando** wraps their nails around the Golden Ticket

for Best Halloween Event, taking it from previous holder **Knott's Berry Farm**. Knott's places second in 2008. **Knoebels**, **Kennywood**, and **Cedar Point** take respective third, fourth, and fifth rankings to complete the finalists.

New for this year is Best Christmas Event. It's amazing how many parks capture the magic of the holidays, with new parks adding such festivals each year. Dominating this new category is **Dollywood** with 38 percent of the vote. Being finalists in more categories (eight) than any other park, Dollywood takes the

gold for Christmas Event.

"The shows, the millions of lights and all that great holiday food really get families in the mood for the holidays," says Pete Owens, public relations manager for Dollywood. "This year's addition of the Polar Express 4D to the festival mix will just add another reason for families to visit."

Placing second in this new event is **Magic Kingdom** at Walt Disney World. Sister park **Disneyland** follows closely at third, with **Silver Dollar City** and **Hersheypark** rounding out the top five.

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Go for a ride!

Perennial favorites maintain awards in several categories; New walk-through attraction category added for 2008

New for the Golden Tickets this year is a category that doesn't necessarily count as a "ride" but more of an attraction. Funhouses and walk-through attractions (usually scary) carry a flavor all their own. It's a matter of interaction with one's self, whether it be a sense of humor or sense of fear. It's all in good fun.

Such attractions aren't as easy to find within the U.S. anymore. While once staples at any amusement park, litigious times have taken their toll on such whimsical fun and most parks have removed these classic experiences. Europe seems to have more of them than their North American counterparts. We asked our panel what fun could still be found.

Frankenstein Castle's at **Indiana Beach** is the American favorite by gathering 36 percent of the vote. This spooky, multi-level walk-through has numerous sight gags and tricks to make one gasp, scream and laugh. Close behind is **Kennywood's** Noah's Ark with 33 percent of the vote. This tilting, rocking fun house like attraction has many fun moments that test the guest's skill at walking while enjoying whimsical scenes along the way. While some was updated in relatively recent times, Noah's Ark dates back to 1936.

The Europeans are also in on the fun. Noted for their elaborate examples of both genres, Hotel Gasten at **Liseberg** in Sweden delivers one of the scariest and detailed haunted walk-throughs in a theme park, while **Grona Lund's** Lustiga Huset is a huge fun-house full of mirrors, slides, gags, and seemingly endless pratfalls. Both of these attractions tie for third, and many U.S. enthusiasts are envious that such fun is difficult to find in their own neck of the woods.

In the Best Carousel category, both the top two finalists allow their guests to reach for the brass ring while rid-



ing, another throwback to yesteryear that's nice to see still around. **Knoebels** takes top honors with 48 percent of the vote. **Santa Cruz Beach Boardwalk** lands 21 percent.

Roland Hopkins, editor of *Carousel News and Trader*, says that Knoebels' carousel goes beyond the brass ring. "Charles Carmell carved extremely expressive and elaborately decorated horses," says Hopkins. "Knoebels has done a very nice job to maintain and retain the integrity of the historic 95-year old

machine which makes it very rare."

Six Flags Over Georgia celebrates 100 years of the Riverview Carousel at their park this season. The ride comes in third. Rounding out the top five is **Islands of Adventure's** whimsical Car-Seuss-el and **Six Flags Great America's** double decker work of beauty.

Best Water Ride in an amusement park once again goes to **Islands of Adventure's** Dudley Do-Right's Ripsaw Falls. Valhalla at **Blackpool Pleasure Beach** comes in second with its combination water ride/dark ride. Splash Mountain at **Disneyland**,

Popeye and Bluto's Bilge-rat Barges at IOA, and Journey to Atlantis at SeaWorld Orlando all take third through fifth, respectively.

Going over to the dark side, **Islands of Adventures** scoops the Best Dark Ride category with 36 percent of the vote. Climbing a notch this year is Twilight Zone Tower of Terror at **Disney's Hollywood Studios**. **Knoebels'** ever-popular Haunted Mansion takes third. New to the category is **Hard Rock Park's** very trippy Nights in White Satin which comes in fourth. **Disneyland's** classic Pirates of the Caribbean rounds out the category.

A new contender has taken over the Golden Ticket for Best Indoor Roller Coaster. **Universal Orlando** has frightened the daylights out of many riders with *Revenge of the Mummy*, and our panel

has loved it, with voting at 28 percent. The high tech coaster lets guests experience all the suspense, drama, and even a little humor of the blockbuster movies. The highly-themed queue line allows explorers to stumble across artifacts and sometimes someone just waiting around the corner. The immersive roller coaster incorporates many animated figures, audio, fog, fire, and even creep scarabs crawling all around you. A "fake out" ending is also a hoot. The cat-

egory's previous winner, *Rock 'N Roller Coaster* at **Disney's Hollywood Studios**, places second. **Disneyland's** famous Space Mountain voyages into third place. **West Edmonton Mall's** massive *Mindbender* and **Kennywood's** clever *Exterminator* complete the top five.

Master Blaster at **Schlitterbahn** retains its lock on Best Waterpark Ride. Sneaking up close behind is **Splashin' Safari's** multi-passenger *Zoombabwe* coming

in at second. The innovative, electromagnetic uphill water-coaster *Deluge* finds **Kentucky Kingdom** rounding out our top three. **Schlitterbahn's** brand new *Dragon's Revenge* and *Black Anaconda* at **Noah's Ark** are the other finalists. Of note, four of the five finalists are uphill waterslide attractions.

Kings Island also keeps its long-running hold on Best Kids Area. While the Paramount movie themes have been dropped from the property,

Cedar Fair has retained rights to the Nickelodeon branding. Three children's coasters, numerous children's rides, waterplay areas, a haunted interactive dark ride, and a family flume complement the area.

Other finalists in this category are **Islands of Adventure's** *Seuss Landing*, **Knott's Berry Farm's** *Camp Snoopy*. Finishing the top five are **Kings Dominion** and **Nickelodeon Universe** at the Mall of America.



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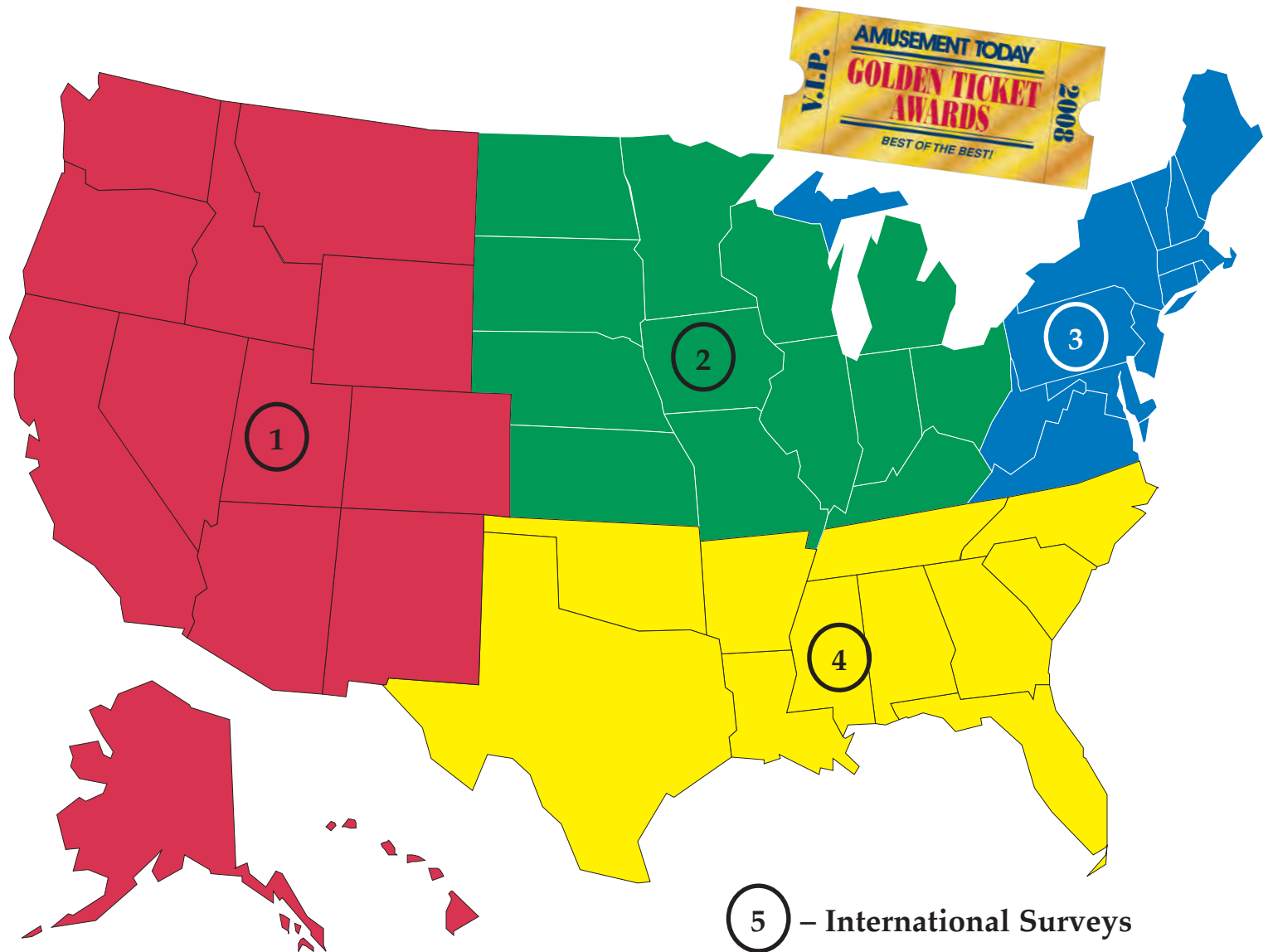
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Our panel of experts

Since the beginning of the Golden Ticket Awards in 1998, *Amusement Today* has sought out the most experienced and well-travelled amusement park enthusiasts. Using a fair and balanced protocol of dividing ballots equally among four regions of the United States and another portion for international voters, *AT* receives representation from all around the world.

But who are these people and what are they like? More than 84 percent of them have been to 50 or more parks, and 88 percent of them have visited parks outside their home country. 92 percent of them own at least one season pass, and 60 percent own two or more. On average, 39 percent report they visit 10-20 parks each year, and 26 percent state they visit more than 20. 47 percent boast that they have been on more than 500 roller coasters, with 41 percent claiming a range between 250-500.

Kudos to this great group of experts!



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2008 Best New Rides go to Waldameer and Schlitterbahn

Paul Nelson didn't give up. For over a decade he knew what he wanted.

Standing next to the station of Ravine Flyer II is a picnic shelter. It was originally the station house of the Ravine Flyer, a wooden coaster built in the 1920s.

Any other park operator would have just built a new coaster down the center or along the edge of the park. But Nelson knew he wanted to utilize the ravine just as the original did. It took him more than 15 years of work, but he got what he wanted. Park fans have now given him something extra.

Ravine Flyer II unquestionably won the category of Best New Ride in a Park. With 52 percent of participants casting their vote for this magnificent new wooden coaster by The Gravity Group, Paul Nelson really knows he has a signature ride that puts Waldameer Park on the map. Quite simply, it is what every park owner dreams of having. With a bridge that lets coast-

er trains fly *over* the adjacent highway, Waldameer has a new attraction like no other. With such a stunt it almost makes billboards seem passe'.

This is the third win for The Gravity Group for Best New Ride following their successes with Hades in 2005 and Voyage in 2006. Their fourth project, **Boardwalk Bullet**, came in second behind Ravine Flyer II. Although the Kemah Boardwalk coaster opened last year, it made its debut after last year's balloting had been counted, thus pushing it into this voting term.

Also in the top five are B&M's massvie **Behemoth** at Canada's Wonderland and

Led Zeppelin The Ride at Hard Rock Park. **Evel Knievel** at Six Flags St. Louis, even with a late start out of the gate, managed to roar into the top five. It is the latest creation by Great Coasters International, Inc.

What's old is new again. Or at least that is how it seems when looking at new waterpark attractions. Two of our finalists took existing attractions and re-invented them.

Taking Best New Ride in a Waterpark for 2008 is Schlitterbahn and its inventive new **Dragon's Revenge**. In 1994, the park premiered Dragon Blaster, the first uphill water coaster. Having taken the concept bigger, taller, and

faster with Master Blaster, the park did an extreme makeover with theming and effects. The attraction now features fog, an original soundtrack, faux fire, fiber optics, a spinning tunnel, and video projection, all during an up-and-down waterslide adventure.

"My favorite part of the ride is the cool fog effect," says Darren Hill, general manager for Schlitterbahn. "And the music. And the fiber optics and the encounter with the dragon...I love the whole thing!" Hill adds, "From concept to completion, to guest satisfaction, our new ride has been a homerun."

Schlitterbahn isn't the

only park to be thinking outside the box. SeaWorld's brand new Aquatica received high marks for its clever use of incorporating riders with Commerson's dolphins on its **Dolphin Plunge** ride by using clear tubes that slide through their domain. Likewise, creative thinking also was shown at Wet'n Wild Orlando with the re-launch of their **Black Hole: the Next Generation** attraction. New lighting, color, and effects made for a whole new experience as passengers slide down darkened tubes now illuminated with cosmic wizardry.

Coming in fourth is Water Country USA's **Rock & Roll Island**. This new addition features a slide tower named after classic 50s dances, a children's area, and a lazy river that creates "the island." Aquatica also places once again in fifth for their eight-lane, eye-popping **Taumata Racer** from Whitewater West.

He pulled together 33,000 independent companies (representing more than 400,000 employees) and asked if they would contribute one-percent of their total payroll each month to help fund the construction of a themed resort. The catch, admission to the theme parks would be free to the workers who contribute to the fund. Eighty-nine percent of all money collected would go toward the construction of the resort, with the remaining 11 percent going towards administrative fees.

The resort began with a simple hotel. Pools, cabins and restaurants would soon follow. In Nov. 1997 the Xocomil waterpark opened to guests.

Designed by Canada's Whitewater, this heavily themed and landscaped park features 11 Whitewater attractions to choose from. After entertaining more than 1 million guests in its opening year, the park became a spring board for the resort to build the Xetulul theme park as well as more hotels and other amenities on the property.

Thanks to the ground work laid by Xocomil, the IRTA Resort now employs 3,000 workers and has entertained more than 38 million visitors to date.

As the numbers will tell you, Xocomil is quality, Disney quality and AT's pick for **Park of the Year**.

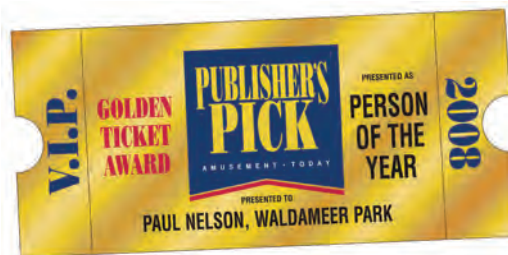
The second generation, Antonio Zamperla, took 'amusement' to a new level in the 1960's when he started the concept of building amusement rides.

Zamperla now produces more than 180 rides each year and has a product catalog in excess of 60 different rides. It has expanded to the United States and beyond to employ a global workforce of 450 associates.

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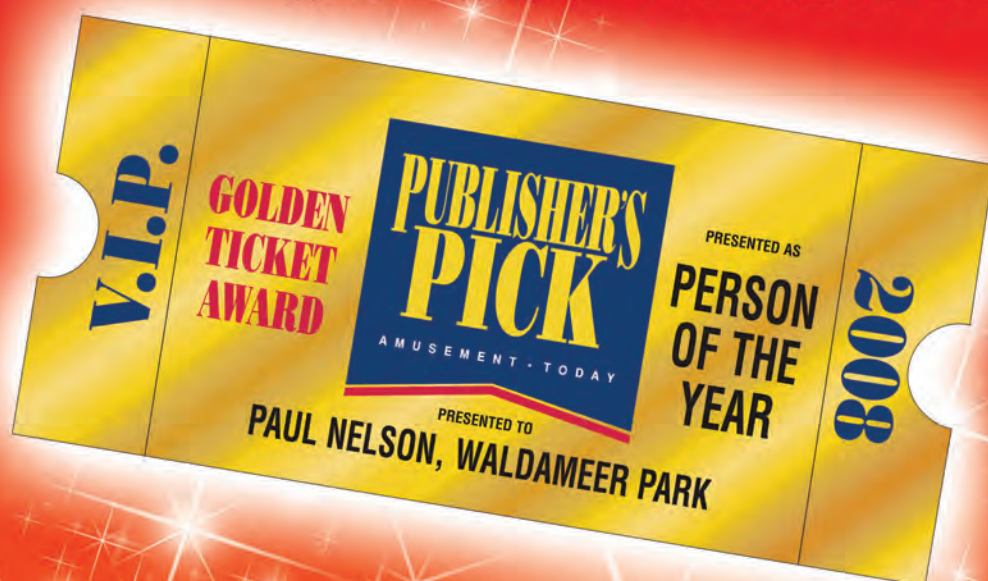


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The Speed of Steel!

Six Flags New England's Superman flies high as Best Steel Coaster

Six Flags New England proudly boasts the "#1 Steel Coaster" on banners outside of **Superman Ride of Steel's** station and on the inside as well. Cleverly, they've saved room for another. For a fourth time, the Intamin mega coaster built in 2000 has flown off with the top prize.

Jeffrey Seifert, roller coaster census director for American Coaster Enthusiasts, agrees with the fanfare. "It is simply the best coaster in the world!" Seifert continues, "This particular layout is such a signature piece for the park; you won't find a duplicate anywhere or anything close to it." Coaster enthusiasts have praised the ride for its amazing abundance of airtime. "Even after eight years it still manages to deliver like no other coaster can," adds Seifert.

For the first time in Golden Ticket history, point totals for a roller coaster have burst through the 1300 barrier. Superman has done it in a big way. Or would that be a "super" way?

Turn back the calendar to 1998 when the Golden Ticket



Awards were first initiated. At that time, 10 years ago, *Amusement Today's* simple survey garnered enough points for the number one steel coaster to boast 466 points. (A voter's top coaster gets ten points, their tenth choice gets one point.)

Looking at today's charts, one not only sees higher totals as support for the Golden Tickets has surged ever higher, but also how things actually are in a flow of continuous change. Only two of the top 10 coasters this year would have been eligible in 1998, as all others have been built since *AT* introduced its original survey. Certainly, newer and more exciting coasters are always being created.

B&M and Intamin appear to dominate the charts of fan favorites, but vintage designs from Arrow and Schwarzkopf, as well as a scattering of other newer suppliers make it a steel coaster smorgasbord. Intamin has provided the top

two coasters on the chart, both built in 2000, as well as Europe's highest rated coaster, **Expedition GeForce**. B&M boasts the most designs on the chart, claiming 20 of the top 50.

Two new-for-2008 rides debuted on the charts this year. Toronto's **Behemoth** (No. 29) at Canada's Wonderland opened to rave reviews with its newer style of trains. Hersheypark also introduced **Fahrenheit** (No. 46), perhaps the most clever and creative name for a coaster this season (a year that has been marred with several naming missteps). **Dominator's** change of location didn't keep it off the lists as it moved from Geauga Lake to Kings Dominion. It saw a return to the charts at No. 43.

Six Flags Over Georgia has seen its towering **Goliath** rise each season. Its jump from eighth place up to sixth was due to an increase of more than 250 points over its previous total.

Unlike wood, tubular steel coasters are less than half a century old. The rides with the most age under their

belts are classics from master designer Anton Schwarzkopf. **Whizzer** (No. 45) at Six Flags Great America gets some face time on the charts this year, and two vintage classics, **Mind Bender** (No. 15) at Six Flags Over Georgia and **Shock Wave** (No. 31) at Six Flags Over Texas, performed better on the charts in 2008 over last year. Thanks to track work and other off-season rehab efforts, both are operating in top condition.

Another success story is Cedar Point's **Magnum**. While other taller and faster coasters have come along (at its very own park, in fact) **Magnum XL-200** still rides proudly in the top 10. It was the first

coaster to break the 200-foot barrier and started parks everywhere to try and push the envelope. These mega coasters have surfaced around the globe, typically being the top draw at each park.

Eight coasters from outside the U.S. appear in the rankings. West Edmonton Mall's **Mindbender** (No. 43) is the largest indoor coaster in the world, and Europa Park's **Euro Mir** (No. 40) offers one of the most one-of-a-kind coaster experiences on the planet.

According to ACE's online census, there are 2,074 coasters in the world, obviously making for heavy competition. Kings Island appears to be gearing up for a big 2009 debut. Next year's Golden Ticket panel will decide if it upsets the top 10.

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Wooden Wonders!

Holiday World's Voyage repeats as the Best Wooden Coaster

The wooden charts bear some insightful investigation. Since the Golden Tickets began in 1998, the top woodie has had a brief stint in the spotlight and then a younger challenger comes up to replace it. Holiday World's *Raven* held the position the longest for four seasons, while others have snagged the prize for shorter periods. It's a hard battle to remain in the top ranks, and some see their glory fade a bit.

The Voyage enjoys its second year in the top spot with a comfortable lead. Of note, however, is the clear fight for second place, a blitzkrieg that could happen at any moment. All contenders in places two through five saw a significant jump of more than a hundred points over last year's poll. The point spread between these spots are tight with just barely more than 50 points separating second place from fourth.

The most significant jump on the charts was Great Adventure's **El Toro**. In its three years it has hopped from its debut spot at No. 13 to a

top 10 position in 2007 by doubling its points, rising to No. 9. This season it doubles its points once again launching it up to fourth place and upsetting the ranks in the middle of the top 10 pack. Could it be the one to tumble *The Voyage* off its perch in the years ahead?

A story even more exciting

is the cut-off margin for the top 10. Waldameer's new-for-2008 **Ravine Flyer II** missed out of bursting into the upper echelon by one point. Holiday World's *Raven* hung on to the No. 10 spot with a single tally over the new Gravity Group hit coaster, which took Best New Ride this year. Ravine

Flyer II, as it gathers more and more fans, should effortlessly climb into the top 10 next year.

Other new coasters are jumping onto the charts. GCII's massive **Troy**, which opened in the The Netherlands last season, debuts this year with a significant No. 26 placement.



Kemah's **Boardwalk Bullet**, which debuted late in 2007 lands at No. 39. Also new in 2008 is St. Louis' **Evel Knievel**. Even with a late June opening, it jumps on the charts at No. 44, just slightly above its two St. Louis brethren. Look for a stronger charge up the list next season.

Three racing coasters land on the charts this year. Hersheypark's **Lightning Racer** continues its accolade of being the top racing coaster on the planet. Kennywood's **Racer** (No. 47) and Blackpool's **Grand National** (No. 27) racing coasters share a common bond as both of those courses have riders departing on one side of the station and returning on the other. Only three such coasters exist in the world.

The oldest coaster in our top 50 is Kennywood's venerable **Jack Rabbit** (1921). Even with its demure size, it has legions of fans with its famed

Nine coasters on the lists operate outside the U.S., the highest ranking being Liseberg's **Balder** (No. 15). **Coaster** (No. 31) at Playland in Canada celebrates a 50th anniversary this season.

New competition for 2009 is already underway. Our panel of riders are sure to juggle their own lists next year.

John Chidester, Holiday World's marketing director, beams, "The fact that Voyage remains number one is truly an honor. We're tickled! We are very thankful to our riders."

Can The Voyage remain on top? Or will any of the top five poised to take over grab the gold next season? Stay tuned.

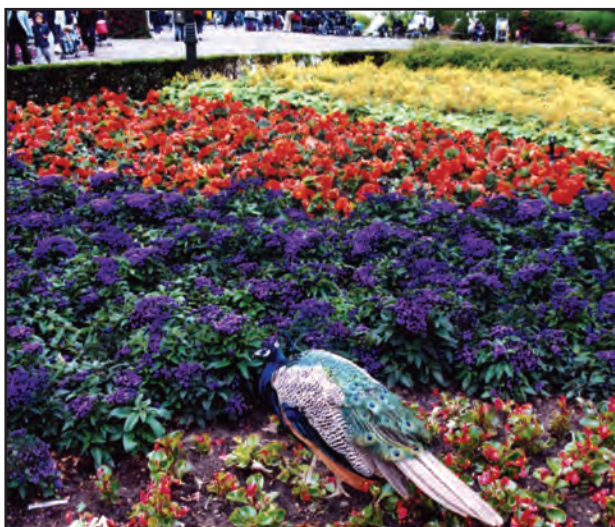
