#### Winners named in 2nd annual survey

## Amusement Today's 1999 Golden Ticket Awards

As you may recall, Amusement Today introduced a survey in 1998 to poll the well-traveled park experts and experienced enthusiasts to recognize the Best of the Best within the amusement industry. With an even larger response this year — and not to mention new parks and a mother lode of new coasters for the 1999 season the results, as always, prove very interesting.

#### Survey overview

The poll group selected to complete the survey certainly could boast some well-traveled experience. A greater familiarity with the North American coasters is apparent among those chosen, but the wood and steel coaster lists each show overseas entries. Anyone who believes a single vote doesn't count only has to glance at the point totals to see the value of each opinion.

Using various sources, selected afficionados were evenly balanced by dividing the United States into four geographical regions, with an equal number of surveys sent to each region. Incidentally, all 50 states had a representative to receive a survey. An additional amount of surveys were sent outside the United States to represent foreign expertise.

Of the surveys returned, the southern region, eastern region, and north central United States each represented 25 percent of the votes cast. The west coast region accounted for 17 percent of the votes, and foreign surveys accounted for the remaining 8 percent. Industry manufacturers, park management and the staff of Amusement Today were not included in survey recipients.

#### New for 1999

Because the surveys had to be sent back to Amusement Today postmarked by July 6, new-for-'99 installations had a challenge to work their way into the ranks in such a short time. This amazing feat was accomplished by

eight steel coasters. The top performer was Superman Ride of Steel, the only 1999 coaster to break into the top ten in just a few short weeks. Other new steel creations to appear on the list are Raging Bull at No. 14, Medusa at No. 16, Top Gun at No. 18, and Apollo's Chariot in 20th place.

Both of Universal's Islands of Adventure coasters, the Incredible Hulk and Dueling Dragons, landed on the list at No. 19 and No. 21, respectively. Completing new-for-'99 steel coasters is SeaWorld San Antonio's Steel Eel at No. 23.

The only new wooden coaster to appear on the list is Knott's Berry Farm's Ghost Rider, which opened to rave reviews last December. Two 1998 masterpieces, Visionland's Rampage Michigan's Adventure's Shivering Timbers, both reached the top five in their second year of existence.

#### Something old...

But modern coasters didn't necessarily have all the fun. Coney Island's Cyclone, the 1927 benchmark for all wooden coasters, still rides in the top 10 at No. 8 after 72 years. Blackpool Pleasure Beach's Grand National also appears on the list this year. The venerable racing coaster was built in 1935.

Relocation has proven to be quite the success story for many rides, as the No. 5, No. 6 and No. 21 wooden roller coasters — Comet at Great Escape, Phoenix at Knoebel's Grove and Wild One at Six Flags America, respectively had been moved from former homes, only to be reborn winners at their new parks and a true triumph for preservation to coaster enthusiasts.

Also of note is the continued enjoyment of the Coaster at Playland in British Columbia. With the Pacific National Exhibition still in uncertain negotiations to move, it appears this classic will continue to roll for at least a few years more before fears of the wrecking ball rise anew. An international look

A familiarity with the North American coasters is obvious with the surveys returned. However, many experienced enthusiasts continue to travel the globe in search of the great ride beyond their borders. An obvious example is Oakwood's Megafobia. The Wales coaster lands in top five on nearly every survey on which it appears — with the majority of the time taking the No. 1 spot. This renowned excellence makes it the top international ride on our list and in the wooden top 10.

Likewise, a more remote location is Parc Asterix in France, where Tonnerre de Zeus captured those enthusiasts who made it there. It ranks in the top five of every survey panelist who has experienced it. Just mere points from making our list, look for it to rise in future years as more experts get to France.

#### Park categories

The park and ride categories allow the Best of the Best to truly shine. The abundance of parks and rides submitted clearly shows that the industry is doing several things right.

Again this year, Cedar Point in Sandusky, Ohio leads the way for Best Amusement Park to visit. Strong contenders that follow are Busch Gardens Williamsburg, the traditionally classic Kennywood, and the brand-new superpark Islands of Adventure.

The uniqueness of New Braunfel's Schlitterbahn gives it a clear and unbeatable lead for Best Waterpark. On the banks of the spring-fed Comal River, its amazing mix of attractions continues to delight waterpark guests in record numbers. Also splashing in is Wildwater Kingdom in Allentown, Pa., and tying for

third are Walt Disney World's Blizzard Beach and Typhoon Lagoon.

The outstanding and courteous staff at Holiday World in Santa Claus, Ind. repeatedly earn top marks for Friendliest Staff. Knoebel's Grove and Walt Disney World round out the category this year.

The biggest lead of any category is Busch Gardens Williamsburg for Best Landscaping. While most agree that the majority of the parks look nice and are well kept, Williamsburg takes command in this category by claiming over half of all votes cast. A distant second is held by the lushly landscaped Walt Disney World and England's Alton

The return of *Rockin' at Rockville* showcases the live performances of Fiesta Texas, a park long known for outstanding shows. Its first-place status this year for Best Shows illustrates that parent company Six Flags/Premier Parks has not lost sight of the park's roots. Also placing highly are Busch Gardens Williamsburg and Dollywood in Pigeon Forge, Tenn.

Yum. People are enjoying the food at parks out there. Twenty-seven parks were nominated for the Best Food category. Ironically, the results declared a three-way tie with Busch Gardens Williamsburg, Kennywood, and Knoebel's Grove sharing the accolades.

Various comments from those who took the survey indicated that by and large, the parks they visit are very clean. Certain parks seemed recognizably so, with Busch Gardens Williamsburg receiving top honors for Cleanest Park. Walt Disney World and Holiday World also rate highly.

Long lines or slow lines are the bane of many park guests. A clear winner in this category is Cedar Point for Best Capacity. The park's fast-moving lines are an exemplary blueprint for the industry to follow. Walt Disney World and Kennywood are recognized in this category as well.

Themed experiences are a big goal for parks today. The lush and dramatic theming of Universal's Islands of Adventure is spectacular. Its new Dueling Dragons is bestowed the honor of Best Theming in this year's survey. Also of note are Alton Tower's Nemesis, Disneyland's Indiana Jones and Walt Disney World's Twilight Zone Tower of Terror.

Schlitterbahn's Master Blaster all but monopolized the Best Waterpark Ride. The only other contender is the Pepsi Aquablast at Wildwater Kingdom.

Best (noncoaster) Ride went to Intamin for their Giant Drop rides, with frequent mention of AstroWorld's Dungeon Drop. Also popular are the tower rides by S&S Sports, delivering Space Shot and Turbo Drop experiences.

The Amazing Adventures of Spiderman not only rounds out the best noncoaster rides, but tops the list for Best Indoor Attraction. Haunted is also "in," with five attractions mentioned and Knoebel's Haunted Mansion tying Spiderman for first. Disney's Indiana Jones scores high marks for third.
