Fourteen winners named in survey

The summer season is always a time for regular guests and park enthusiasts to seek out new thrills and attractions at their local parks or vacation destinations across the country. It also is the time for a selected group to share their expertise in rating the "Best of the Best" for Amusement Today's Golden Ticket Awards.

Survey overview

In setting a balanced standard, *Amusement Today* has continuously mailed an equal number of surveys to participants divided into four geographical regions of the United States. In addition, a select group of international enthusiasts include their expertise of the parks outside the United States.

Of the surveys returned, the largest percentage came from the east coast (33 percent), with the north central states (21 percent), the southern region (20 percent), and the west coast states (17 percent) responding respectively. nine percent of the responses were from international areas. Industry manufacturers, park management, and the staff of *Amusement Today* were not included in survey recipients.

New for 2000


Due to an early July postmark deadline, it is always a challenge for a park to see results of their latest coaster appearing in the list, yet seven roller coasters that opened in 2000 made their way into the ranks.

Certainly the most dramatic debut of any coaster ever has to be Cedar Point's Millennium Force, premiering at the No. 2 Unquestionably the "must-get-to" ride of the year, only Cedar Point's venerable Magnum ranked higher. Other steel coasters were Superman Ride of Steel at Six Flags New England (No. 10), Goliath at Six Flags Magic Mountain (No. 18) and Superman Ultimate Escape premiering at Six Flags Ohio (No. 25).

The wooden coaster category brought numerous surprises this year. Holiday World's renowned Raven, considered by most enthusiasts as the "ultimate night ride," rose to the top of the list this year, proving that bigger doesn't always mean better. Its newest brother, The Legend, also has debuted at No. 7, making Holiday World the only park to feature two wooden coasters in the top ten list. Other new arrivals are Lake Compounce's marvelous new Boulder Dash (No. 12) and the Villain at Six Flags Ohio (No. 21).

While not new for this season, two new performers climbed their way into the rankings. Knoebel's Twister (No. 15) opened last season just after the Golden Ticket survey was tabulated. As you may recall, *AT* predicted last year that France's Tonerre de Zeus would climb into the upper echelon of coasters as more afficionados are making their way to this distant location. Predictions for the years to

come? Hersheypark's new Lightning Racer and Silverwood's Tremors look to be rising forces ready to land on the charts.

Oldies but goodies

But new doesn't always mean best. Coney Island's vintage Cyclone, Kennywood's Thunderbolt and Vancouver's Coaster all have 30 years or more under their belt. All three of these coasters are designated by the American Coaster Enthusiasts as Coaster Classics. Two other valued designs on the list are Knoebel's Phoenix and the Great Escape Comet, which

had previous lives dating back to 1947 until being relocated to their current homes in the 80s and 90s.

An international look

Vancouver, Canada, doesn't boast the only coaster out of the United States on the charts. The aforementioned Tonerre de Zeus, Alton Tower's Nemesis, the Mindbender at Edmonton's Galaxyland and the highly rated Megafobia from Oakwood in Wales are positioned on the lists.

Park categories

Any business likes to hear when they are doing things right. The amusement industry is no exception.

The top three places in the Best Park category clearly illus-

trate what guests are looking for. Cedar Point, with a history of putting in big rides (and lots of them), is always a hit with guests wanting thrills. For the third year in a row, they take top honors for Best Park. Coming in second, Knoebel's Grove is a true leader in offering their guests real, honest value for their money. Great rides, great atmosphere, and great people at an affordable price. Claiming third this year is Islands Of Adventure. Universal spared no expense in created this ultimate themed environment. All of these qualities help place these three parks at the top of the charts.

With apparent an unbreakable grip on the first place spot, Schlitterbahn's one-of-a-kind mix of unique attractions, ideal location and shady environment and cutting-edge innovation culminate in creating the Best Waterpark, according to our survey participants. Blizzard Beach and Wildwater Kingdom, known for their strengths come in second and third respectively.

One visit to Holiday World and guests know why the park is consistently voted as Friendliest Park. And would Santa have it any other way, really? Holiday World has excelled at instilling friendliness from management on down. Coming in second is Knoebel's Grove, and the always pleasant folks at Walt Disney World take third.

There are two categories that seem to be a sure bet each year. Best Capacity easily goes to Cedar Point for moving its lines efficiently and Best Landscaping goes to the perennial favorite, Busch Gardens Williamsburg. In both of these cases, over half of the votes were cast on these parks' behalf. Walt Disney World placed second in both of these categories, and Disneyland and Islands of Adventure shared third place for capacity, while Alton Towers took third for their landscaping.

The battle for Best Food always is hard fought as many parks offer tempting taste treats for their guests. Knoebel's Grove comes out on

top with their delicious, affordable selection. Kennywood, famous for their fries, places second. Third place goes to Busch Williamsburg, known for great food in establishments with great atmosphere.

Best Shows once again belongs to Fiesta Texas in San Antonio. Throughout the various changes of ownership in its nine years of operation, the showpark's roots run deep and are not forgotten as this beautiful property continues to grow. Busch Williamsburg and Walt Disney World also are recognized.

As a keynote speaker at a recent convention, Pat Koch, the matriarch of Holiday World and Splashin' Safari, spoke some powerful words. "I expect the park to be as clean when the guests are leaving as when they arrive." Being a

ination of Disneyland's Indiana Jones and the Temple of the Forbidden Eye land the attraction at second place. The understated humor and appropriate thematic details have Busch Gardens' Alpengeist placing at third.

One of the most seemingly difficult questions for our
survey panelists to answer is
the Best Waterpark Ride.
Schlitterbahn's Master Blaster
came in first. The second place
listing is much less specific,
people simply liked lazy river
attractions at whatever park
they visited. Schlitterbahn
also placed third with their
Raging River, a tube chute
attraction that takes riders 3040 minutes to complete.

Islands of Adventure takes top honors in two categories. The Amazing Adventures of Spiderman

took first place in the Best Non-coaster Ride and Best Indoor Attraction. Other favorites in the non-coaster category were S&S Towers, with Cedar Point's Power Tower and the Stratosphere

Big Shot being the most commonly mentioned installations when a single attraction was specified. Intamin's Giant Drops were a close follow-up with Paramount's Kings Islands' Drop Zone garnering many specific mentions. New for the Golden Tickets this year was the strong showing for the Huss Frisbee. This newer attraction is now appearing at more parks each year. Two other indoor attractions taking second and third place were Knoebel's beloved Haunted Mansion and the

Indiana Jones themed indoor

thrillor at Dienovland



somewhat rare perspective in the industry, it is not a surprise to see Holiday World rise to first place with such direction and leadership. Taking second and third place are Busch Gardens Williamsburg and Walt Disney World, parks that are experts in cleanliness.



Other notable designers from the list include Cobb, Fetterman, Miller, Keenan, Prior and Church, and Vettel. 19 of the coasters operate with PTC trains. 2 coasters operate with Gerstlaurer trains.



Fast Facts: Eleven of the steel coasters were designed and built by Bollinger and Mabillard (nine of which are in the top 15). Both Arrow and Intamin lay claim to four coasters placing on the list. Three classics from Schwarzkopf still reside among the best. Morgan Manufacturing produced two rides on the list. Giovanola's first coaster in North America also premieres on the list.

Point totals were tallied from an exclusive number of experienced park patrons equally selected from four geographic regions of the United States, with an additional amount from outside the U.S.A. Top choice received 10 points, with the 10th choice receiving one point. Point totals are listed on the charts.
